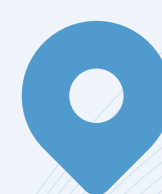

Dr. Hugh Taylor
Chair of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Sciences, Yale School of Medicine

Dr. Taylor is the Anita O'Keeffe Young Professor and Chair, Department of Obstetrics Gynecology and Reproductive Sciences at Yale School of Medicine and Chief of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Yale-New Haven Hospital. He is immediate past president of American Society of Reproductive Medicine.

He is also Professor of Molecular, Cellular and Developmental biology at Yale University. Dr. Hugh Taylor received his undergraduate training at Yale University and received his medical degree from the University of Connecticut School of Medicine. He completed his residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at Yale. His postdoctoral training included a fellowship in Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility as well as a fellowship in Molecular Biology, both at Yale.

Dr. Taylor is a recipient of ten National Institutes of Health research grants and directs The Yale Center for Reproductive Biology. Dr. Taylor has published more than 400 articles and in leading medical journals. Dr. Taylor's research on prenatal exposure to cell phone radiation was published in Scientific Reports. His team found increased hyperactivity and memory damage in mice. He has served as President of the Society for Reproductive Investigation and is president of the American Society for Reproductive Medicine. He is a member of the National Academy of Medicine.



Dr. Hillel Baldwin
Neurosurgeon

Dr. Baldwin recently retired from clinical practice in neurosurgery in Tucson, AZ at the Carondelet Neurological Institute with an emphasis on complex and minimally invasive spine procedures in addition to Skull base, pituitary and brain tumor surgery. During his career, Dr. Baldwin has served as Chief of Neurosurgery at Tucson Medical Center, Northwest Medical Center and El Dorado Hospital in Tucson. Baldwin also served as president of the Arizona Neurosurgical Society. His interests in the health effects of radiofrequency and electromagnetic fields began about 4 years ago when his wife Jennifer was diagnosed with Electro- hypersensitivity. He now serves on the board of the Environmental Health Trust and has lectured to numerous layperson and physician audiences about the health ramifications of our present electrified environment.



Devra L. Davis, PhD, MPH,
President Environmental Health Trust

Dr. Devra Davis is an award-winning scientist and writer who has published more than 220 scientific articles, She is the acclaimed author of several popular books including Disconnect--the truth about cell phone radiation, 2010, awarded Silver Medal by Nautilus Books, and National Book Award Finalist for When Smoke Ran Like Water. Davis was a founding director of the Board on Environmental Studies and Toxicology of the U.S. National Research Council, National Academy of Sciences (NAS) and has worked on numerous environmental exposures, from chemicals to lead to air pollution. She has appeared on a wide range of media including CNN with Sanjay Gupta, MSNBC, CBS, Fox News with Tucker Carlson and NPR. Davis is the founder & president of Environmental Health Trust—a proud partner of Old Bills.



Theodora Scarato MSW
Executive Director of Environmental Health Trust

Scarato is a clinical social worker. She has published research on environmental health and recently co-authored a chapter in a nursing textbook on environmental health. She has championed several successful efforts to protect children's health. Her investigative work led to Prince George's County addressing the lead contamination in their school water fountains and her advocacy on safe technology led to the MD state commission on children's environmental health issuing led to recommendations on safer technology in schools. Scarato has led EHT's successful policy efforts at the local and national level including a recent lawsuit Environmental Health Trust v. the FCC.



Gay Browne
Author of Living With A Green Heart: How to keep your body, your home and your planet healthy in an increasingly toxic world.

Browne built the first 'pre-LEED' certified house in 1994 and in 2005 launched Greenopia: An Urban Dweller's Guide to Green Living: How to shop, live and eat green in your local community. In Fall 2022, she is launching a weekly inspirational podcast and blog series that will interview environmental heroes, telling their stories about the outstanding things they are doing in their field, to make the world a safer and healthier place. Over the years, she has worked with many nonprofits, including being a long-term board trustee of WaterKeeper Alliance. Gay has won numerous awards, including being chosen as a 2008 EPA International Climate Protection Award.
